Below are instructions on how to use the prosthetic:)

1. Supplies:

Ideally, you'd want to have an adhesive (I recommend Pro's Aide or Spirit Gum), and Liquid Latex to blend the edges. Both can be purchased off Amazon or Ebay. If you just want to buy one product, get liquid latex as it can be used as adhesive too (just not as good).

2. Trim the prosthetic:

- test how the prosthetic fits your face, it should be thin and flexible enough to accommodate most faces.
- if too large, trim some of the edges with a sharp scissor (especially mouth area to accommodate for your top lip)
 - do the same with the baldcap if too big

3. Sticking the prosthesis:

- using a small paintbrush, apply adhesive (Pro's Aide / Spirit Gum / Liquid Latex) around the edges of the prosthetic, and everywhere it touches your face (nose ridge, middle brows, etc).
 - allow adhesive to dry until sticky (faster with hairdryer)
 - apply to face, press firmly and wait long enough to allow sticking.

4. Blend the edges (optional):

- cut vey thin strips of toilet paper
- position them at the edge and, using a cheap brush (or your finger), apply liquid latex to it, so as to blend the edges of the prosthetic.
 - dry latex with hairdryer (ammonia is smelly and irritating, but not really toxic)

5. Makeup:

- latex behaves like skin so you can use normal
- I personally use foundation first, then a good brand of face paint (oil-based are better)

Pro's Aide is pricey but great, used by most professional make-up artists. If used properly, the prosthetic should stay on for a while. If not, apply more Pro's Aide:) If using other adhesives, you might need to reapply adhesive every hour or so to keep it sticky.
